ARIZONA-SONORA DESERT MUSEUM PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Mescalito *Agave felgeri*

DESCRIPTION: Mescalito is a rare and scattered species of coastal areas and plains in Sonora, Mexico. It grows in very xeric (dry) conditions. A quick grower, the thin-leaved rosettes reach 18” tall. It pups profusely and makes a tight clump. At maturity (7-15 years), an individual rosette of Mescalito sends up a 2 to 8 foot tall spike of yellow flowers. That rosette will then die, but the pups live on.

RECOMMENDED USE: Good for containers, rock gardens, succulent gardens, and enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape.

CULTURE:



Hardiness: At least to lower 20's.



Sun tolerance: Full sun to light shade for best growth.



Watering and feeding: Careful not to overwater. Feed twice a year in containers.
No fertilizer necessary when planted in the ground.



Soil requirements: Use a fast-draining potting soil in containers. Sandy soil is best in the ground.



Pruning: Only to remove rosettes which have bloomed and died.

CULTURE:



Hardiness: At least to lower 20's.



Sun tolerance: Full sun to light shade for best growth.



Watering and feeding: Careful not to overwater. Feed twice a year in containers.
No fertilizer necessary when planted in the ground.



Soil requirements: Use a fast-draining potting soil in containers. Sandy soil is best in the ground.



Pruning: Only to remove rosettes which have bloomed and died.
