

ARIZONA-SONORA DESERT MUSEUM PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Fluorescent Spurge or Gopher Plant Euphorbia rigida

DESCRIPTION: A small to medium semi-succulent evergreen subshrub to 3' tall. Foliage and stems are a striking blue-green in color. All parts contain milky sap. It is this sap, in the roots, that supposedly repels gophers; hence its common name. Early spring brings on showy clusters of chartreuse flower bracts. Fluorescent Spurge is native to dry, rocky slopes around the Mediterranean region.

RECOMMENDED USE: Use for foliage color, flowering accent, ground cover, border, enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape, or in a patio container.

CULTURE:

Hardiness: Very cold and heat hardy in Tucson.



Sun tolerance: Full sun to light shade.



Watering and feeding: Low water use. No feeding necessary in the ground.

Soil requirements: Any soil that drains will do.

Pruning: After flowering, prune back old stems.
