Tucson, AZ (October 3, 2013) – On December 7-8, the Desert Museum in partnering with Tohono O'odham Community Action (TOCA) for a weekend celebration of Native culture at the *Celebration of Basketry and Native Food Festival*. Join hundreds of Native basket weavers and traditional food producers in a dynamic celebration of tribal food and fiber traditions.

The event will include numerous weaving demonstrations. Attendees can meet the artisans and learn how basketry connects native communities. Visitors can explore the Basketry Marketplace where weavers from across the U.S. join forces for the world's largest basketry market. It's a great way to find unique holiday gifts for friends and family members.

Visitors also will be able to watch and sample traditional and innovative preparation of Native foods by top chefs and traditional Native cooks. Presentations will include four open fire cooking demonstrations throughout the Museum grounds.

The stellar chefs will showcase their culinary skills with preparations and tastings of contemporary dishes using traditional ingredients.
