PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Desert Flame Bush Anisacanthus quadrifidus varieties

DESCRIPTION: Native to Mexico and southern Texas, this deciduous shrub attracts hummingbirds with vibrant red-orange flowers throughout the summer and fall. Can be evergreen during mild winters.

Anisacanthus quadrifidus v. brevilobus 'Mountain Flame' ®

This variety has narrow, grey-green leaves on plants five feet tall and three feet wide.

Anisacanthus quadrifidus v. wrightii 'Mexican Flame' ®

This variety reaches about four feet tall and three feet wide. Compared to 'Mountain Flame', the leaves are broader and the flower color is more intense.

RECOMMENDED USE: Plants provide a good low-maintenance component of the xeriscape.

CULTURE:



Hardiness: Down to 10°F.

Sun tolerance: Full sun.



Watering and feeding: Requiring little water, plants may be irrigated about twice



month during the hot season to keep in flower.



Soil requirements: Will tolerate all but heavy clay soil.

Pruning: Lightly to shape.
