## **Brick-red Pea Flower**

## Brongniartia tenuifolia

**DESCRIPTION:** Little is known horticulturally about this twiggy perennial shrub. It grows naturally in the Tropical Deciduous Forests of northern Mexico. It grows at a moderate rate to around 3' tall. It is open and wand-like. An attractive feature of this species is its blooms, which as the name suggests, are brick-red to burgundy-red. They are pea-flower shaped and occur in the summer.

**RECOMMENDED USE:** Not a structurally showy plant, but fits in well with other shrubs for a splash of color in the summer.

## **CULTURE:**

**Hardiness**: Has survived 18°F at the Desert Museum.



**Sun tolerance**: Full sun to light all-day shade.



Watering and feeding: Low to moderate water needs. Fertilization is not necessary.



**Soil requirements**: Any soil will do.



**Pruning**: Lightly, as needed to shape.
