Snakeweed

Guttierezia species

DESCRIPTION: Also known as Broomweed, Snakeweed is a twiggy perennial in the sunflower family. Growth is moderate to a foot or two tall and as wide. Evergreen leaves are shiny. Flowering can begin as early as June and run into the early winter. It is covered with tiny yellow flowers at this time, providing a good nectar source for butterflies. Snakeweed is native to grasslands, chaparral, and oak woodlands throughout the Southwest.

RECOMMENDED USE: Good to attract butterflies. Makes a great addition to an enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape.
