

## ARIZONA-SONORA DESERT MUSEUM PLANT CARE INFORMATION

## Thicket Creeper Parthenocissus inserta

**DESCRIPTION:** This semi-woody perennial vine is closely related to the Virginia Creeper. It grows quickly, clambering and weakly climbing to 40'. It often has beautiful fall color and is winter deciduous. Flowers are small and white to pale blue in spring or summer. These blooms are followed by fleshy fruit. Thicket Creeper is native to NE United States. Some persons are sensitive to this plant and have skin irritations or allergic reactions.

**RECOMMENDED USE:** Use to cover a shaded fence or as a ground cover.

## **CULTURE:**



Hardiness: Very hardy; to at least 10°F.

Sun tolerance: Full morning sun to light shade is best.



Watering and feeding: Moderate water use. Feed in the spring.

Soil requirements: Any soil will do.



**Pruning**: As needed to control.
