PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Talinum

Talinum triangulare

DESCRIPTION: This semi-succulent perennial is an understory plant in the Tropical Deciduous Forests of Mexico. Growing from tuberous roots, stems sprout quickly in the late spring, forming a low, leafy plant reminiscent of bonsai. Half-inch wide bell-shaped flowers can be white to rich pink. Our form has the dark pink flowers. Flowering occurs throughout the growing season.

RECOMMENDED USE: Good for containers, as it is frost tender. Because it dies to the ground in the winter, it makes a good accent to put into other potted plants for seasonal color.

CULTURE:



Hardiness: Unknown outdoors; probably should protect from freezing temperatures.



Sun tolerance: Can take very bright conditions, but should be protected from afternoon sun.



Watering and feeding: Moderate water use. Fertilize monthly when growing.



Soil requirements: Any potting soil.



Pruning: Prune dead flower stalks.
