PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Angelita Daisy

Tetraneuris acaulis

DESCRIPTION: Angelita Daisy is a herbaceous perennial native to the southwestern US, where it occurs on dry, rocky slopes and hills from 3500 to 6500' elevation. The compact form, with dense slender green leaves, is complimented by deep gold daisy flowers. It forms rounded clumps to fifteen inches tall and wide. If water is available, it will naturalize in the landscape. In Arizona, this plant may bloom all year with especially heavy bloom in the spring and fall months.

RECOMMENDED USE: is a wonderful plant to use as a border in front of larger shrubs (accent, specimen, shade, form, color, screen, barrier, ground cover, border, enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape, patio container, hanging pot, attract wildlife, etc.)

CULTURE:



Hardiness: It is very cold hardy. Expect it to go dormant when temperatures drop below about 10° F.



Sun tolerance: Plant in full sun.



Watering and feeding: Drought tolerant once established. Fertilized twice a year.



Soil requirements: Angelita daisy seems to prefer well-drained soils



Pruning: A prolonged bloom results in many dried flower stalks. Cut off the old flower spikes occasionally to rejuvenate the plant and initiate new flower production.
