PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Soap Tree Yucca Yucca elata

DESCRIPTION: Soap Tree Yucca is a structurally beautiful yucca from throughout the southwest. This slow to moderate growing plant has hundreds of narrow flexible in heads at the end of branches. Eventually, it can form a trunk of 15' or more. The white bell-shaped blooms are moth pollinated, but also a hummingbird favorite.

RECOMMENDED USE: Use as an accent, specimen, or in an enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape.

CULTURE:

Hardiness: At least hardy to 0°F. It has also proven to be heat and drought tolerant.



Sun tolerance: Plant in full sun.



Watering and feeding: Low water use in the ground. Water weekly in a container. Fertilize twice a year.



Soil requirements: Best in deeper, well-drained soil.



Pruning: None needed.
